PhotoVoice enables children to share their unique community perspectives and experiences through photography.

Our aim is for all children to participate and have their voices heard, but we understand support may be needed.

Parents or carers can help their child by holding the phone or camera, making suggestions on what to photograph, or interpreting their child's behaviour as something they like in the community.

Plumtree will use the photos and what children like about the experience to create stories that show what children with disability like doing, why they enjoy it and how the experience could be improved.

Inclusion starts with 'welcome'

Our aim is to encourage communities to create more places and spaces accessible to children with disability where they feel welcome.
